

To whom it may concern,

I work as a Project Manager for a Civil Engineering company in the Midlands.

Archers Structures have now completed 2 high profile contracts for me in the last year, the first of which was a £4.4million Composting Facility at Ufton (near Leamington Spa), the second was a £60,000 Canopy tag on to an existing shed for Coca Cola Enterprises.

The Composting Facility comprised a large Process Hall, Fan House, Plant room, Screen Room and Pump Room - all of which were standard steelwork and profiled cladding, but in a complex plan. The scheme was particularly tight programme wise and such complexity involved key programming and phasing. The scheme was brought in on budget and in time with some 70,000 man hours with no lost time accidents. Archers played a key role in the completion of the project.

The Canopy at Coca Cola (just handed over last week) was a standard tag on extension to an existing shed constructed with Kinspan cladding. The key issue on this scheme was the high profile aspect of the job, the intense safety issues imposed by working on a live distribution depot, and the tight programme involved due to Coca Cola increasing their turnover at the site (the Canopy was constructed in 5 weeks - Pad foundations to completion).

I would have no hesitation in employing Archers again and found them pro-active in all aspects of their involvement in the 2 builds.
